

he first letter in the 22 letter Hebrew Aleph ₩ Beyt □ is Aleph.

Aleph  $\forall$  is also the number 1.

The picture that anchors the meaning of Aleph  $\forall$  is the picture of an **OX**.

It should not surprise us that the Hebrew word for **OX** is Aleph.



Aleph  $\forall$  is the one letter Pictograph of an **OX**.



The Ox is a picture of the strong leader. Aleph Strength and Leadership



is the picture of

Aleph  $\nabla$  pictured as the **OX** is meant to convey the idea of the Strong Leader, the Head of the family.

The Ox is also gentle and aloof.

The Ox also parts the hoof and chews the cud. This is also meant to be understood as an illustration.

The cleft hoof pictures parting or a separating yourself from the ways of the world.

Chewing the cud is meant to remind us to constantly meditate on God's Word.

You can envision the OX as the head of the family, leading the family to fresh water and lush pasture. Aleph  $\nabla$  pictured as an OX is the strong leader that protects and guides the herd.

Each of the Hebrew letters, based on an original Pictograph, has a colloquial familiar conversational meaning and a deeper spiritual significance that elevates the significance of each of the 22 letters in the Hebrew Aleph  $\forall$  Beyt  $\Box$ .






The general Spiritual meaning of the 22 Hebrew symbols may be disclosed to anyone who takes the time to investigate them. They are not hidden or encoded, but clearly displayed.

The Supernatural significance of the Hebrew letters and words are by their very Divine design meant to be revelatory. As such, while they can be seen with the human eye they can only be fully perceived in order that they may accomplish their Divine purpose through eyes of faith.

If you think this is an odd notion then consider what God has clearly revealed in the very letters and words that we read in the Holy Scriptures. God is not unclear about the purpose of His revelation to man.

#### **ISAIAH 55:11**

So, shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it.







What exactly does this mean? *Genesis 1:2* gives us a picture that is both astounding and miraculous.




#### **GENESIS 1:2**

And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

And what happened when God's Spirit moved upon the void that was formless and dark?

The answer is in *Genesis 1:3*.



Let me summarize.

God has a Supernatural purpose for his spiritually significant words. Words that in the original language of the Garden of Eden were revealed as pictures and numbers that, though modified from the Original, exist to this day with their original meaning intact.


The language of the Garden became known as the Hebrew Language. The only language that left the Garden of Eden unmolested and unchanged. The only language that was not corrupted over 1700 later at the Tower of Babel.

How do we know this?


God revealed it through his prophet Zephaniah in a passage that also prophesied the return of both Judah and Israel to the land of Israel where they would

**Aleph**  $\nabla$  is also the ancient three-letter WORD **Aleph**  $\nabla$  **Lamed**  $\bigcap$  **Pey**  $\bigcap$  **for OX**.

Aleph, the Word OX, forever anchors the meaning of Aleph  $\nabla$  the one letter as it is the ancient Hebrew word for OX.

The pictographic meaning of the three letter word OX give us additional information about the meaning of the one letter symbol Aleph  $\forall$ .

# Aleph Original to Modern

The original symbol for Aleph ♥ was changed to modern Hebrew letter Aleph N while the Southern Kingdom of Judah was in captivity in Babylon. The Modern block script bears little resemblance to the original pictographic symbol of an **OX** that was revealed in the beginning.

# Number Meaning of Aleph <del>▼</del>

In addition to the Picture meaning of Aleph ♥ there is also a number meaning.

Aleph in Hebrew is the Number 1.

# ALEPH + 1

The meaning of Aleph  $\forall$  as a number is unique as the number 1 is not divisible by any other number and is the one number that is contained in all the other numbers.

The number one is the one number that stands for Unity, Sufficiency and Independence.

The Picture and Number layers of revelation in the Hebrew letter Aleph  $\forall$  is meant to disclose all sorts of ideas but the central idea of both the picture and number of the first letter in the Hebrew Aleph  $\forall$  Beyt  $\Box$  is *Deity*.

Aleph's  $\forall$  Spiritual meaning is meant to point us to God the Father. He is the First and nothing can have a beginning without Him. He is the Strong Leader that cares for and protects his family.

In the very first verse in the ancient Hebrew prophetic text we call the Old Testament, the letter Aleph  $\checkmark$  appears twice as many times as any other Hebrew letter.

The third word in the Scripture begins with an Aleph  $\forall$  and identifies Elohim as the Creator.

Why is this significant?

The number three is one of four sacred numbers in Scripture and it means Divine Perfection.







The letter Aleph  $\forall$  occurs four times in row in the first four Hebrew words in the Scripture. Is it a surprise that Four is the number of Creation?



Many of the most prominent Hebrew Words begin with the letter Aleph  $\forall$ .

As you look at just a few of the important Hebrew words that begin with Aleph  $\forall$  please keep in mind that Hebrew is written from right to left.

In Genesis 1 we are introduced to the central figure in all Creation. His Name is Elohim and He is the Creator of Heaven and Earth. The English version of the bible translates Elohim as GOD.

Whenever you see the name God in the Scriptures you are looking at the first name for God revealed in the Scripture, a name that begins with the Hebrew letter Aleph  $\overline{\forall}$ .



Beyt is the second letter in the Hebrew Aleph 7 - Beyt and is meant to convey the idea of the House and the Family.



Beyt is also the number 2.

The letter Beyt □ in the conventional Hebrew means In or Inside.

The first example of this is the word Berisheet, the first word in the bible.

Berisheet is the word that begins with the letter Beyt and is translated into English as **IN BEGINNING**.

We are all familiar with the famous prologue to the creation account found in *Genesis 1:1...* In the beginning.

As a Pictograph the first letter invites us to ask who lives inside the house?



The answer is, the family lives inside the house.

The Original Pictograph of the tent or house has been preserved as a foundational idea not only in the Original Picture that is

embedded in the single LETTER *Beyt* but also by fact that the three letter Hebrew word Beyt spelled Beyt Yood Tav is the Hebrew Word that is literally translated Tent or House and implies a Family.

The Pictographic translation of the three letter Word for TENT or HOUSE gives us additional insight into the spiritual significance of the first symbol in the Hebrew Aleph  $\forall$  Beyt  $\Box$ 

Let's take a look at it and see if we can see the spiritual significance of the one letter Beyt that is disclosed in the three-letter word Beyt.

The Spiritual Messianic meaning of the number 2, Beyt is meant to point us to The Son of God, the second person in the Trinity.

#### 10 Ordinal Perfection

Yood is also the number 10. The number 10 is one of four sacred numbers used in Scripture and it means **ORDINAL PERFECTION**.

Yood the second letter in the WORD Beyt reveals that a plan revealed in heaven is going to unfold as a mighty Divine Deed on the earth.

The final letter in the three-letter word Beyt □ is TAV.



Tav † is the last letter in the Hebrew Aleph ₹ Beyt □ and it is pictured as crossed-sticks or a CROSS and it signifies a Covenant or a Sign.

While the earthly idea that God is revealing by the picture of the house or tent includes the entire household there is an additional heavenly meaning that is magnified when we look at the Word Beyt.





# The Hebrew Word BEYT



The WORD Beyt reveals that the SON OF GOD who left his heavenly home in order to accomplish a plan that was ORDAINED in heaven in order to keep a promise made between the Father and the Son. That promise or covenant will be revealed as the SIGN of a Cross.

Now you know the Spiritual Heavenly meaning of the one letter Beyt as it is disclosed in the Picture meaning of the Word Beyt pictured as a **TENT** or **HOUSE**.

You might want to consider that the plan revealed in the Word Beyt is all about taking us Home to live with the Father and the Son. This can only be accomplished by the Cross.

Beyt reveals the Prince that lives in His Heavenly Father's House.

Who is this Prince?

He is the only begotten son of God.


The word for Son in Hebrew is the word Bar composed of the two Hebrew letters Beyt Reysh ? The picture meaning of Beyt Reysh ? will be presented in just a minute.





The pictograph of Beyt as a Tent or a House has changed over time from the original pictograph of Beyt as a floor plan of a house or tent to the Modern Hebrew that bears little resemblance to the original symbol that pictured the floor plan of a tent or a house.





The Hebrew Letter Beyt  $\square$  is not only pictured as a Tent, it is also the number 2.

The meaning of the single letter Beyt is discovered not only in the picture but also in the number.

#### Remember that in the Hebrew language the Letters are also Numbers.

The number 2 is very important and it should not be a surprise that it is the very first number found in the Bible.

The creation account in *Genesis 1:1* begins with the letter Beyt , the picture of a Tent and the number two.

The number 2 can have a dual meaning.

Two is a number made up of two other numbers and can be meant to communicate that there is a difference of opinion, good or evil.


The number 2 also tells us that another one can come along side to either hinder or help.

The most elevated and ideal Messianic meaning of the number 2 is to reveal to us the second person of the Trinity, God the Son.

The following Hebrew Word begins with the letter Beyt and once you learn to read the picture and number language of Hebrew you will discover how the letter Beyt, the picture of a House and the number 2 open up a world of revelation hidden just under the surface.

Let me introduce you to one of the most important Hebrew words that begins with the letter Beyt and supports the pictographic and numeric meaning of Beyt as a HOME.

Let's take a look at the Hebrew Word for SON. The Hebrew Word Beyt  $\square$  Reysh  $\lozenge$ .

The Modern Hebrew letter Gimel \( \) bears some resemblance to the original pictographic symbol \( \) of a **CAMEL**. This is one picture that could be misidentified except for the fact that the Word Gimel \( \) lets us know that the original picture is meant to illustrate the shoulders and neck of a camel.

The picture symbol of a **CAMEL** can be seen over the progression of time. You can see the original ancient symbol for Gimel \( \subseteq \text{ features the camel's long neck and head. The Modern Hebrew symbol for Gimel \( \subseteq \text{ that is used today is similar to the ancient pictograph as it attempts to illustrate a camel kneeling.

#### Picture of Gimel Original to Modern



Gimel \( \subseteq \) as a picture has the meaning of receiving a blessing or a benefit.

The main idea contained in the picture of Gimel \( \subset is to Lift Up. \)

Gimel \\_ can in some instances convey the idea of being Lifted up in Pride.

Most often, Gimel \(\bigcup \) is pictured as someone that carries your burden and relieves you from toil and hardship.

The Gimel is also a picture of the Holy Spirit, who aids us in lifting up, meditating upon and exalting the Name of the Lord. This picture is amplified by the fact that Gimel \(\bigcup \) is also the number 3, spiritually signifying the third person in the Trinity, the Holy Spirit.



The most prominent and unique characteristic of a camel is that the camel carries a large reservoir of water in the fatty tissues throughout the camel's body, much of which are contained in its hump(s).

It is no coincidence that every time a camel stands up He is quite literally lifting up the water.

Can you envision the Holy Spirit lifting up the Living Water, the Son of God?




Consider the words of Yeshua our Redeemer as recorded in John 4:13-14.

13 Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again:

14 But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.

Let's connect that truth to the one Jesus announces in *John 12:32*.



In addition to the Picture meaning of Gimel as a blessing and benefit there is also an amazing number meaning.



As mentioned, Gimel in Hebrew is the number 3.





The number 3 is no ordinary number, it is one of four Sacred Numbers and it means **DIVINE PERFECTION**.

The meaning of Gimel \( \sum \) as a number is unique as it means completeness. The number three represents Omniscience, Omnipresence and Omnipotence.

God knows All, God is everywhere, and God is all powerful – these three attributes illustrate Divine Perfection.

The number three also reveals and points us to God the Holy Spirit.

In the very first chapter in the ancient Hebrew prophetic text we call the Old Testament, the letter Gimel \_ appears twice in the 16<sup>th</sup> verse.

"And God made two **great** lights; the **greater** light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night:

he made the stars also."

The Hebrew words for Great and Greater both begin with Gimel . The context in the conventional Hebrew where we find the first use of the Hebrew Letter Gimel is not a coincidence as it introduces Light. The Holy Spirit is the one who both reveals and enlightens.

It is no accident that Gimel \\_ which is a picture of the Holy Spirit is first used in the Hebrew Scriptures as the word Great and Greater. Notice the context. God is describing the two lights that man completely depends upon for illumination and sustenance on the earth.

Without the two great lights, the sun and the moon, mankind would be in total physical darkness and unable to sustain himself.

Without the Holy Spirit we would have no Spiritual light and would be doomed to eternal darkness.





As you look at just a few of the important Hebrew words that begin with Gimel please keep in mind that Hebrew is written from right to left.

Many prominent Hebrew Words begin with the Letter Gimel \(\bigcup.\). Notice how these three words have to do with being lifted up.





"To Be Lifted Up"

The first letter of the three Hebrew words we will be exploring all begin with the letter/symbol Gimel \(\bigcup.\).

I would like you to read all the possible meanings of Gimel \( \subseteq \) as both a picture and a number.

Consider the following list of possible meanings of the letter Gimel \( \) as a MENU. It is a collection of root concepts that can be used to understand the meaning of the Hebrew words that all start with the letter Gimel \( \).

Most are familiar with the concept of "First Usage." The basic idea is that the first time a word is used in the bible is important because it can be a major clue as to how that word is to be understood whenever it is subsequently used. The same is true of the Hebrew letters/symbols.

This does not mean that the meaning cannot be nuanced or altered slightly by the other concepts that surround it as they have additional meanings that may slightly alter the "strict" meaning of a single letter such as Gimel \(\bigcup.\).

The key to understanding the pictures and numbers is based on the context of both how the letter is used in a word and how it is used in the context of the surrounding revelation.

This principle can be applied in two ways in order to help you understand what the Lord is revealing.

For example, the first time the letter Gimel is used in the Scripture is in *Genesis 1:16* as noted earlier in this chapter.

"And God made two **great** lights; the **greater** light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night:

he made the stars also."

The take away from this is that whenever you see the letter Gimel \\_ you have a general context for understanding it meaning as related in some way to Great or Greater.

The concept of Lifting Up or being Lifted Up is directly connected in many ways to the idea of Great and Greater. There is a connection, but it is a connection that must be understood in the context of the Hebrew meaning of the Word, and the greater context of how that word is being used.

Take a look at the possible meaning of Gimel 🖵 .







The **3rd** letter in the Hebrew Alphabet - Has the Meaning of Lift up – Pride – Benefit. As an example every time a Camel stands up it is lifting up the water stored throughout its fatty tissues. This is also a picture of the Holy Spirit lifting up the Living Water, The Son of God.

Gimel the **THIRD** letter in the Hebrew Alphabet is also a picture of the **Holy Spirit**.

The Hebrew Letter Beyt in conventional Hebrew means IN. It can also mean INSIDE.

What is in view with the Hebrew word Pride is not the picture of a literal HOUSE but a metaphor that is used all throughout Scripture to describe the Human Body, the **TENT** or **HOUSE** for man's Soul and Spirit.

The Scriptural proof that support this understanding on the picture of a TENT or a HOUSE can be found in the following Scriptures:

#### 2 PETER 1:12-15 (NEW KING JAMES)

12 For this reason I will not be negligent to remind you always of these things, though you know and are established in the present truth. 13 Yes, I think it is right, as long as I am in this TENT, to stir you up by reminding you,
14 knowing that shortly I must put off my TENT, just as our Lord Jesus Christ

showed me. <sup>15</sup> Moreover I will be careful to ensure that you always have a reminder of these things after my decease.

Four is the number of Creation and so it is no surprise that we have the four seasons, the four divisions of the day, the four elements and the four corners of the earth.

Now you know the meaning of Chet  $\coprod$  the number 8.









Tay † is also the largest single number 400 and it notifies us that there is a time appointed to accomplish the prophetic sign.


This will be the most important divine decree to come down from heaven to be manifest on the earth. And the sign of that appointed event of monumental importance will be recognized by the sign of the Cross.

Consider the first time the letter Tet  $\bigoplus$  us used in the Bible as you read *Genesis 1:4*.




Consider the second time the letter Tet is used in the Bible as you read *Genesis* 1:9-10.

Please note that before Adam's sin corrupted His creation God, was painting a picture of both a Good creation with the prospect of Evil that had not yet manifest but was looming in the background.






The last time the word GOOD is used in the creation account it concludes with the revelation of the tree of the knowledge of GOOD and evil.






You now have a picture of the separation of light and darkness and man's home on dry land encompassed, surrounded and encircled by water.

Instead of questioning God's goodness, man needs to question his motivation, which the LORD GOD happily reveals. He is allowing everything, orchestrating everything, permitting everything and doing everything to promote His glory for our welfare.











The Letter Tet  $\bigoplus$  pictured as a coiled snake is also the number 9.

Based on how the number 9 is used in the Holy Scriptures alone we know that it is the NUMBER that signifies wrath and judgement but it also can mean the magnification of God's Divine perfection.

The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.











Now you know the glorious and unexpected meaning of the WORD Tet 🕀 .



You can read about the picture meaning of Elohim in Chapter One and the meaning of YHVH will be included at the end of this chapter.







As you can see above we have two versions of the Modern Hebrew Letter Kaf || .

The Modern Hebrew letter Kaf  $| \mathbf{l} \mathbf{l} \mathbf{l} |$  on the RIGHT is used everywhere except at the end of a word.

The Modern Hebrew letter Kaf  $\parallel$  on the LEFT is used only at the end of a Hebrew word ending with Kaf  $\parallel$ .

These changes were made while Israel spent 70 years in captivity in Babylon.






Kaf is the one letter associated with the Hebrew word *Atonement*. Most of us are familiar with Yom Kippur, the day of Atonement

Lamed 7 is also the number 30.




The original use of the staff in the Garden of Eden was likely as a harvesting tool.

I can imagine it was useful for all sorts of tasks. For example, can you see Adam pulling down one of the branches of a fruit-laden limb with the crook of his staff in order to inspect the fruit?

After Adam sinned, the staff began to be used a shepherd's staff, and to this day the staff is a symbol of shepherd tending sheep.

Adam's second born son Abel was the first shepherd and he was also the first picture of the Good Shepherd that was prophesied to come to the aid of sinful man.





The first time the letter Lamed is used in a word is in *Genesis 1:5*.

Lamed 7 is the first and third letter in the Hebrew word spelled Lamed 7 Yood Lamed 7 Hey 4, the WORD that means NIGHT.

Since the first use of any word in the bible gives us a clue as to how that word is to be understood in the future, can you see the spiritual meaning and supernatural significance of the Hebrew word Lamed  $\rat{7}$  Yood  $\rat{2}$  Lamed  $\rat{7}$  Hey  $\rat{4}$ ?

The letter Lamed  $\frac{1}{2}$  is also the number 30.

The picture of Lamed  $\frac{1}{2}$  is amplified by the number 30, one number that has contained within it three other numbers that give it great spiritual significance.

But we are getting ahead of ourselves.

First consider that Lamed  $\gamma$  is the number 30 and 30 is its VALUE number.

Lamed  $\ref{1}$  is also the 12<sup>th</sup> letter in the Hebrew Aleph  $\ref{2}$  Beyt  $\ref{2}$ . So, the number 12 is the PLACE number for Lamed  $\ref{1}$ .

Consider that the first 9 Hebrew letters are actually two complimentary numbers. For example, Aleph ♥ is the PLACE number ONE as it is the first letter in the Hebrew-Aleph ♥ Beyt □ and it is also the VALUE number ONE.

In other words, the first nine letters that are also numbers actually have two numbers associated with it — the place number and the value number.

The place number is the number that tells us its order in the 22-letter Aleph  $\nabla$  Beyt  $\square$ .

The value number is the number God assigned it in order to further his revelation to man and to give man a system of calculating numbers that, as you can see is the first decimal system, used to this day.

Now let's look at the letter Lamed  $\gamma$  to see if it contains other numbers of importance.

Zero is not a number, it is a place holder used in the decimal system for the purpose of mathematical calculations.

 $30 \text{ is } 10 \times 3.$ 





We can now add two other numbers to the Place number 12 and the Value number 30.

Lamed  $\gamma$  is a very special number as it contains the following numbers:

- **3** One of four Sacred numbers that means *Divine Perfection*
- 10 One of four Sacred numbers that means *Ordinal Perfection*
- **12** One of four Sacred Numbers that means *Governmental Perfection*

And finally, the number 30 (3  $\times$  10) that is used in the Scriptures as one of the most significant numbers we should consider.

Based on how the number 30 is used in the Holy Scriptures alone we know that it is the number that is the price paid for Redemption.

Thirty is the number that also represents silver as a symbol of the price paid in order to free those in bondage.

Thirty is the one number in Scripture that informs us that in order for sin to be covered there must be a sacrificial blood sacrifice.

If 20 means Salvation then it follows that the number 30 or Lamed  $\ref{1}$  is the price paid for that Salvation.

The number 30 informs us that there was a Blood Sacrifice required as the Price of Redemption.

Thirty is 3 times 10. Three is the first of four Sacred numbers and means Divine Perfection and ten is the Sacred number that means Ordinal Perfection. When

you combine the two sacred numbers you get Divine Perfection planned in heaven and unfolded on the earth through a series of events that concluded in the completion of a perfect plan.

Does anything come to mind?



Hebrew is a Verb first language and English is a Noun first language, and as they say, *never the twain shall meet*.

When Westerners read literal Hebrew it almost always results in confusion simply because the Western mind applies a different filter with different expectations.

The Western mind typically organizes information in a linear fashion, the idea of one concept following another in ingrained in our thinking.



God does not have a Western mind and His word needs to be understood through His filter.

The following picture word is a great example.

We begin with the first letter Lamed  $\frac{1}{2}$ , the staff that urges us forward.

The next letter is Mem  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\smile}$ , the picture of water

The final letter is Dalet  $\mathbf{U}$ , the picture of a door.

The Western mind is driven by convention to translate this word picture as a Lamed  $\ref{1}$  a shepherd leading sheep to Mem  $\ref{2}$  or water and then I suppose back home by way of Dalet  $\ref{1}$ , the pathway.

Now let's look at the picture through the Eastern mind's verb first filter.

**LAMED** 7 – The staff represents the shepherd urging us forward

**DALET**  – through the Door that opens up the Pathway to

MEM **→** – water, a metaphor of eternal life.

When God wants to emphasize something he often puts it in between two other action pictures. In this revelation we have the action of urging us forward and the action of opening a door to travel on a path that leads to water.

The spiritual significance of the word is amazing.

Lamed 7 is a picture of the Good Shepherd that leads the sheep to life giving water. The Good Shepherd is Lamed 7 and he is the Voice of Authority. It is His Teaching that urges mankind to enter the Doorway and follow the path that leads to Life.

We are meant to ask four questions:

Who is the Staff?

Who is the Door?

Who is the Pathway?

Who is the Water?

God's word clearly gives us the answer.



As you can see above, the modern Hebrew letter Mem 

includes two versions. The

Modern symbol on the right is used everywhere except at the end of a word.

The modern symbol for the letter Mem  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\longrightarrow}$  on the left is used only at the end of a Hebrew Word ending in Mem  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\longrightarrow}$ .

When the modern Hebrew letter Mem 

is used at the end of a Hebrew Word it means that the word is plural.

For the purposes of our study we will be using the ORIGINAL Hebrew pictograph.









This would include the water that came up like a mist from the ground before the flood.





After the flood it was the symbol of liquid including rainwater, the water flowing in a stream or the dangerous waters of a flood.

But, while Mem  $\stackrel{\smile}{\sim}$  is most often a picture of water it is also a picture of liquid. NOT just any liquid, but the very liquid that God reveals is the source of LIFE.

This liquid is so important both physically and spiritually that it is included in the name of the first man Adam.

Without blood there is no physical life.



There are dozens of verses I could have chosen, let me read just one from the last book in the Bible.



In Summary:


Mem is most often pictured as either the massive waters like a Tsunami or Flood that represents Chaos and Confusion.

Ordinal perfection or the number 10 lets us know what the number 40 is all about. The number 10 Yood \_\_ notifies us that this is all about a plan ordained in heaven the is going to manifest at the appointed time on the earth.

And it answers the question of who this is for.

The number 4 tells us that this plan is for all God's creation.

The letter em  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\longrightarrow}$  is also the number 40.

So, in summary Mem  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\smile}$  the number 40 is the number that represents trials and a period of probation that includes chastisement and discipline but not judgment.

Forty represents a Probationary Period that will result in Renewal and Revival.

What follows the period of probation signified by the picture and number meaning of Mem  $\checkmark$ , the number 40? It includes the picture of Mem  $\checkmark$  as water.

After Probation is it clear that man will always fail to meet the perfect standards of God. Man is by nature a sinner under the penalty of sin, which results in separation from God.






oon is the 14<sup>th</sup> letter in the Hebrew Alphabet and is pictured as a sprout and a fish. While both a fish and a sprout picture something that is alive, the sprout is meant to signify Life that is rooted in the soil and the Fish is a picture of Activity, action and constant motion that never stays in the same place twice. Or as we might say, the fish is always on the move.

Notice that both fish and sprouts are connected to Mem  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\searrow}$  the 13<sup>th</sup> letter in the Hebrew Aleph  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\bigtriangledown}$  - Beyt  $\stackrel{\frown}{\Box}$  that is a picture of Water and is the Hebrew symbol that precedes the 14th letter Noon  $\stackrel{\checkmark}{\smile}$ .

Notice also that a plant and a fish need water in order to sustain life. The significance of this will become clearer when we explore the spiritual significance of the Hebrew number noon.

## NOON Letter in Modern Hebrew





The letter Noon  $\longrightarrow$  is also the number 50.

The number 50 is one of the most spiritually significant numbers in both the Old and New Testament.

Based on how the number 50 is used in the Holy Scriptures alone we know that it is the number that signifies Abundant and Magnified Grace.

We know that 50 is 10 x 5. Ten is the number of Ordinal Perfection and 5 is the number of Grace.

It is no surprise then that we see both the plans of God -10 and the Grace of God -5 revealed in the number **50**.

Fifty is the number of Jubilee and signifies deliverance from bondage and a return to a bountiful inheritance. It is a picture of Grace followed by Rest.

Fifty is also one of the very few numbers in the Hebrew Aleph  $\bigvee$  Beyt that is designed to reveal a specific time period. This supports the use of the number 10 in the scriptures as a Divine Multiplier that very often is meant to communicate the passage of a specific period of time. Remember the 10 x 5 is 50 the number of years between Jubilees. And remember that Zero is not a number it is a place holder and, in this instance, and many others it is a placeholder for TIME.

What time period is in view?





The answer is found in two things the Lord himself established to take place during a specific time period.

One time period and the one most recognized is JUBILEE, a time period of **50** years.

The second time period is 50 days and has reference to what we know as Pentecost.



So, what does this have to do with the picture meaning of Noon 🛰 , the fish and the sprout?

We noticed that the three-letter word for Noon — was spelled Noon — Yood ► Noon ► and we wondered what the hand doing a divine deed had to do with the fish and the sprout.


We now are about to discover the answer. The answer is found in God's JUBILEE.

What was the Jubilee designed to do?

The answer is not hard to understand as the Jubilee was a manifestation of Grace that was designed to return the Jews to their inheritance. It was both renewal, and deliverance as all debts were canceled and all claims on their property were released. It was designed for The Jews in general and each Jewish family in particular who were given a piece of land as an everlasting inheritance for them and their offspring.

This land was often sold or leased. In times of hardship the property was often used to pay off bad debts and often the debtor found themselves and their family in physical bondage and living outside of their inheritance.

Whatever the reason, the JUBILEE was a 50-year repeating cycle of renewal and deliverance from debt and bondage. It was designed by God to return the land to its original owner and set all those captives at liberty.





Do you see the picture of the fish, with no place it calls home, in perpetual motion and activity?

Now envision the sprout that is rooted in the ground, the land.

Now consider the plans of God as revealed in the Jubilee and the number 50, which is grace represented by the number 5 multiplied by Yood the number 10 that means Ordinal Perfection, the perfect plans of God made in heaven and manifest on the earth. Now you understand why the letter Yood is in the middle of the three-letter word Noon Yood Noon Noon the word that means fish of sprout.

Consider the picture of the Fish and the Sprout, which are both dependent on the water which represents God's everlasting Word as it rains down both blessings and correction on His chosen people.

The summary of the picture and the number that is revealed in the Hebrew letter Noon is a revelation that the life we life on this earth will end in tragedy unless a remedy for our lost condition and separation from God is discovered.

50 is the number Noon and signifies both bondage and deliverance.

The letter Noon is also the guarantee that God's Grace when received with Faith in God's redemptive remedy results in Eternal Life.



When we add up Noon  $\sim$  50 to Yood  $\sim$  10 to Noon  $\sim$  50 we have a summary value number of the word Noon  $\sim$  . That summary number is 110

$$50 + 10 + 50 = 110$$

Let's take a look at what 110 reveals.

Remember that Hebrew numbers are expressed from left to right and the largest number is always the first number displayed. In this case the largest number is Qoof  $\P$  or the number 100.

This is interesting because Qoof  $\P$  is the picture of the back of the head and has the idea of the least and the idea of leaving. What do you see when someone leaves? You see the back of the head.

Who are the most "leaving" people on the earth. There is no contest. It is the "wandering Jew."

This picture is authenticated by the simple fact that 100 is the number of the children of Promise, the Jews.

The easiest way to remember this is that Abraham was 100 years old when he had the miracle child Isaac the Child of Promise and the father of Jacob who is the patriarch of the Children of Israel, the Jews.

So, let's look at this more carefully to see what we can discover about the meaning of the letter and word Noon ••• .

100 is the one number that signifies the Children of Promise. And who are they?

No question about it, they are the Children of Jacob whose name was changed to Israel.

Now let's add the 10 to the number 100 and see what we find.

Ten as you will recall is one of four Sacred numbers and it means Ordinal Perfection.

Yood or the number 10 is often God's multiplier as it notifies us that something was ordained in heaven that is going to manifest on the earth at the appointed time.



Do you see the spiritual significance of the summary value number of the word Noon — expressed as the value number 110?

The message is simple. 10 God has a Plan ordained in heaven for his 100 - Children of Promise, the Jews.

It is a plan that will result in deliverance, a return to their home land after two thousand years of wandering without a home and it will finally result in peace.

The ultimate JUBILEE that occurs at the end of 6000 years of man's sinful rule of the earth and God comes to set up his 1000-year reign.

Everything is in place for that to happen very soon.

So now we have two elements to consider.

- **1.** A plan in Heaven to return the Children of Promise to the Homeland that was accomplished miraculously in 1948.
- 2. Deliverance from the Bondage of Sin followed by REST.

Obviously, the second has not happened yet!

But look what happens when we multiply God's Ordained Plan, the Number 10, by God's Children of Promise the number 100.

What does this reveal?

It reveals the 1000-year millennial reign of Messiah on the Earth. This is the promised rest that is repeated over and over again in the Scriptures. A promise of Land and Rest that was made to the Jews that has not been fulfilled, but will soon become a reality on the earth.









The Jews rejected their Messiah.

But the Messiah did not reject his promises to them and we are told in the Scripture that after two days (two thousand years) the Jews will acknowledge their offense, repent and call upon the Lord to come and rescue them.

Two thousand years from when?

The answer is given in the Scripture.

Two days or (2000 years) after he returns to his place.

What place?

When did he return to that place?

So, you are left with a 5-year window of time to make your most educated guess. I believe it was 30 AD but not everyone agrees and that is alright.

So, when is he coming back to establish his Kingdom?

The answer is really simple, and it was the answer believed by most of the ancient rabbis and the all the early apostles. The answer is after 6 days or 6 thou-





sand years the LORD will come to set up his Kingdom on the 7th day which will begin after the end of the 6th day.

When is that?

Well the easiest way to figure it out is to add 2000 years to the crucifixion event.

So, what does that look like?

I will let you figure it out as you add 2000 years to your best educated guess as to what year Christ was crucified and rose, and promised to return after 2 days or 2000 years.

The Lord promises that when the remnant of believing Jews on the earth at the end of this age repent and cry for him to return saying "Blessed is he that comes in the name of the LORD" he will return to both rescue and set up his kingdom here on the earth.

And how long will that kingdom last on the refurbished earth before God makes all things new again?

### **REVELATION 20:4**

And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years.



amech is the 15<sup>th</sup> LETTER in the Hebrew Aleph → Beyt □. It is also the number 60.









The original picture of the letter Samech † is as column, a prop or a trellis.

The symbol for the letter Samech † has changed over time from the ORIGINAL to the MODERN.

In many cases the Modern symbol  $\overline{\mathcal{O}}$  bears little or no resemblance to the Original Pictogram.

In the case of Samech  $\dagger$ , the Modern symbol  $\circlearrowleft$  actually adds a vital piece of information about the letter Samech  $\dagger$  that we might otherwise have missed.

The modern symbol of Samech  $\bigcirc$  is a circle that has a start and end point. This is very instructive as you will soon discover.

The Letter Samech † is also the number 60.

Based on one of the ways the number 60 is used in the Holy Scriptures, we know that the NUMBER 60 signifies Pride.



So, the number 60 usually, but not always, is a picture of man's pride. Pride in his achievements, his works and his plans.

Pride is something the Lord hates and promises that wherever pride and arrogance blossoms it will be followed by a tumbling and tragic fall.

Now let's look at the Messianic meaning that is contained in the number 60, the opposite of human pride.

The opposite of Pride is Humility.



### 60 is 10 x 6

10 is the number of Ordinal Perfection. Let's boil down the huge meaning of Ordinal Perfection to one simple concept. The concept is simply this. God has made plans in heaven that are going to be manifest at his appointed time on the earth.

So, now let's look at the other side of the coin that pictures Pride.

God has plans for Mankind. Man's Pride is his undoing.

God's plan is the opposite of Pride. God's plans, once received, results in man's Salvation, if he will humbly receive it.

But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.







The 119<sup>th</sup> Psalm is a series of 22 sets of verses. Each set is eight verses and each of the 22 sets of eight verses begins with a letter from the Hebrew Aleph  $\checkmark$  Beyt  $\Box$ .

### SAMECH the WORD





The spiritual meaning of the Hebrew word Samech † can be found in the eight verses revealed in *Psalm 119:113-120* where each verse begins with the Hebrew Picture and Number Samech †.

Let's take a look at one as an example.

PSALM 119:116

Uphold me According unto thy word that I may live and let me NOT be ashamed of my hope.

Now let's take another look at this verse and include the three letters and what they mean. Remember the Samech  $\uparrow$  is the word spelled Samech  $\uparrow$ , Mem  $\searrow$ , Kaf  $\mid \downarrow \mid$ .

Uphold me (Samech) †... do you see a picture of supporting or propping up? According unto thy word (Mem) ... do you see the picture of the Word of God? That I may live (Kaf) ... do you see the picture of Atonement that releases us from the penalty of our sin?

And finally....

...and let me NOT be ashamed of my hope.

The word Samech † reminds us that our hope and our confidence is not in our own achievements. We glory in the Son of God who took upon himself our sins on the Cross of Calvary and guarantees our redemption and salvation in his word.



**15**<sup>th</sup> letter in the Hebrew Alphabet means To Support – To Twist Slowly - To Turn - **Samech** <sup>♣</sup> is Pictured as a **Prop** 

For example, you might prop up the branch of a tree that is laden with fruit and ready to break or snap because of the weight.





Samech is pictured as a Column, Trellis or a Prop and illustrates the concept of holding something up like a column or a forked stick that holds up a limb laden with fruit or providing a framework to which a growing vine can attach itself.

The Modern Hebrew letter Samech looks like a circle  $\overline{\mathcal{O}}$ .

This also illustrates one of the meanings of Samech  $\bigcirc$ . It has the idea of bringing something to a conclusion. We might say a "full circle." Going around and ending up where you started or perhaps more accurately, the idea of encircling a narrative that has a beginning and an ending.

Imagine watching a movie and when you come to the end of the movies, when the entire story is told, it is announced that you have reached **THE END**. It is finished!

The first time the letter Samech † shows up in the bible is as single letter that is not a part of another Hebrew word. This can be found at the end of Genesis 3:24.

What is interesting is that Samech 🕇 the letter is not translated into English. It stands alone at the end of the revelation that begins in Genesis 1:1-Genesis 3:24.

What does this mean?

Let's read *Genesis 3:24* to see if we can discover the concept that rules the letter Samech  $\uparrow$ .

<sup>24</sup> So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the garden of Eden Cherubim's, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life...

This is followed by the single letter Samech. In other words, you have reached the THE END of one scene in the drama of man and are about to view

another scene, or chapter. Once scene or chapter has come full circle another scene is about to begin.

This verse notifies the reader that the Garden of Eden narrative has come to the end point that is meant to connect with the beginning point. So again, it is not just about concluding something it is about considering the cycle or circle that has just finished being wound up like a scroll.

This idea is supported by the meaning of the first use of the letter Samech † in the Bible. Samech † is not a Hebrew letter that is used very often, and in fact there is only one letter that is used less often.

This makes finding the first word that begins with the Hebrew letter Samech even more important. The FIRST use of Samech † at the beginning of a word is found in *Genesis 5:1* where we read the following:

### GENESIS 5:1

This is the **book** of the generations of Adam. In the day that God created man, in the likeness of God made he him;


The word translated as book in English is actually the word SCROLL in Hebrew.

The first time the letter Samech † is used as a word it reveals a Scroll. But not just any scroll. A Scroll that completes the revelation regarding the generations of Adam in the day God created man in His likeness.

When you look at the pictures in this three-letter word for Scroll (Samech Pey Reysh ?) translated into English as Book, you begin to understand what the letter Samech reveals. The concept of revealing a complete story from beginning to end. It is not just the end, it is the entire beginning middle and end that is in view.







The Hebrew word Scroll is translated as Book over 180 times in the Scripture. The letter Samech † is used as the first letter in the word Scroll more often by an order of magnitude than it is used in any other word.

\*SAMECH

Add that to the fact that Samech † is the number 60. The number of Man connected to the idea of Ordinal Perfection gives you the answer to the meaning of Samech †. It is all about the story of God's plans for Man.

You will learn more about this when we investigate the number meaning of Samech †, the number 60. And the three letter Word Samech ‡.

If you use an English Bible search tool to discover how many times the word Scroll is found in the Bible you will be surprised to find that it is only referenced two times — once in the in the Old Testament and once in the new Testament. You will also discover that the second use is quoting the first use in *Isaiah 34*.

Do these two verses support the idea of the completion of a scene in order that another scene might begin? Oh yes it does! In the other places we see Samech used at the beginning of a word it is parsing out small scenes within a larger scene. We are now about to witness the final big-picture scene.

It is pretty hard to miss and once you learn this revelation regarding the Hebrew letter Samech † you will not forget it.

Read what the prophet says...



### **ISAIAH 34:4**

And all the host of heaven shall be dissolved, and the heavens shall be rolled together as a scroll: and all their host shall fall down, as the leaf falleth off from the vine, and as a falling fig from the fig tree.

### **REVELATION 6:14**

And the heaven departed as a scroll when it is rolled together; and every mountain and island were moved out of their places.

Do you see the spiritual significance of the picture of the Scroll that begins with the letter Samech ? When we looked at the first two uses of Samech ? they both had something in common. In both instances they notified the reader that something had conclude.

It was not just the idea of the end of a matter but the idea of the entire chapter or piece in a story coming full circle, pictured as something that progressively cycled like a vine making its way up a column or trellis.

But as you have read in Isaiah and Revelation, all the scenes, all the chapters, all the minor scrolls have a summary scroll, a big picture scene that puts everything into the big picture scene that allows you to see the entire story all at once. The story of the creation of the Heavens and the Earth comes full circle as God rolls it up as a Scroll and puts a match to it. Is this the end of God's plan for mankind? The answer is *yes* and *no*. It is the end of the Heavens that have become infected by the Prince of the Power of the air, and it is the end of the Earth that man has corrupted with sin.

But what follows is astounding!



Is God done with man?

NO, all those from Adam's race who were infected by the sin of Adam but have received God's gracious remedy have a new destiny. The new and glorious destiny is provided by the sacrificial death, burial and resurrection of his Only Begotten Son, the Lord Jesus the Christ. By that sacrifice alone and with nothing added we are preserved from the sad ending of the big story of man that takes place over a period of 7000 years. We will then be Divinely prepared to enter into another story. A story that will NOT end sadly.

A new scroll will begin. It will be a new narrative with a new Heaven and a New Earth to be inhabited only by those who love God and have been changed in order that the first scroll or 7000-year story of man, never be repeated again. **SAMECH** 

And what guarantee do we have that this new adventure will not end badly? We have the unshakable promise of God based on the work accomplished on our behalf by His Son that ALL things are made new, no more sin, no more death, only the manifestation of a scroll that reveals glory to glory without end for all eternity.

Does the last Scroll have your name in it?

I hope so.

The Hebrew word Scroll is translated as Book over 180 times in the Scripture. The letter Samech  $\bigcirc$  is used as the first letter in the Word Scroll more often by an order of magnitude than it is used in any other word.















yin is the 16<sup>th</sup> LETTER in the Hebrew Aleph ₩ Beyt □ . Ayin is also the number 70.

The original picture of the letter Ayin is an Eye.





O AYIN



Ayin pictured as an **EYE** illustrates the idea of Seeing, Knowing, Experiencing and Understanding.

The first time the letter Ayin in used is in *Genesis 1:2* and it is coincidental with the first and second time the letter is revealed in the Bible. This fact, and the fact that this letter shows up in the second verse in the Creation narrative twice puts it in a class with a small group of Hebrew letters that we should take special note of as they are all connected to Divinity and the Creation account.





#### In *Genesis 1:1-3* we read the following:

<sup>1</sup> In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth.


<sup>2</sup> And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

The first time Ayin  $\odot$  is used it is in the context of a picture of the darkness. The second time something new is introduced, the Holy Spirit is hovering over • the chaotic face of the waters that were void and dark.


The darkness that was **OVER** the face of the deep created a void and it is not replaced but it is covered, over-arched by another presence. Something else is now **OVER** the darkness. A greater authority with a new **UNDERSTANDING**.

The Holy Spirit, we are told, moved upon the face of the waters. The literal translation from the Hebrew tell us that the Holy Spirit moved OVER the face of the waters.











The literal Hebrew word that is translated as UPON in English is the two-letter word spelled Ayin ① Lamed 7 and literally mean OVER.

Do you see the picture?

The story begins with chaos and darkness and a void all hovering **OVER** the face of the deep.

In other words, the blind eye that is full of darkness and chaos is now overseen and overshadowed with another vision. No longer a dark vision but a new vision, viewed with the EYE of Wisdom and Understanding.

The Eye ① that is connected to the Staff? that composes the Hebrew word OVER. Lamed? is the voice of authority and so we are to understand that the darkness no longer represents the authoritative voice of Chaos, Confusion, Darkness and Emptiness. What happens after we learn that the Spirit is now hovering OVER the face of the deep? The letter Ayin is also the number 70.

The number 7 is one of four Sacred Numbers.

7 means Divine Completion.

The number 10 is also one of four Sacred Numbers and it means Ordinal Perfection.

When you multiply the two numbers together you get the number 70 that means Perfect Spiritual Order Carried out with All Spiritual Power and Significance.





Seventy also has the meaning of the punishment and restoration of Israel and 70 represents the nations of the World. All the meanings are overarched by the idea of the perfection or completion of a matter.

When you combine the picture and the number meaning of Ayin O, pictured as an Eye and Ayin • the number 70, the disclosure is clear.

Ayin reveals that a mighty deed has been done in order to rescue man from death and destruction and grant him eternal life. This deed was done for men and women from all the nations of the world.







Pey is the picture of a mouth that is speaking a word. You can see the picture of the open mouth clearly in the original pictograph.

The modern block Hebrew letter Pey / has lost some but not all of the original concept, as you picture an open mouth that is speaking.



As you can see below there are two versions of the modern Hebrew Letter Pey 1. The letter Pey 2, seen bottom right is used everywhere except at the end of a Hebrew word. The symbol for the letter Pey on the bottom left is used only at the end of a Hebrew word ending with the letter Pey.

Now let's look at the first use of the letter Pey / in a word in the Bible.

In *Genesis 1:1-3* we read the following:

Pey is the first letter and found for the very first time in the Hebrew word face.

The second time Pey / is used is also in *Genesis 1:2* except this time it is the Spirit of God who is over the **FACE** of the deep.

In summary, the first time the Hebrew letter Pey  $\nearrow$  is used as a word in Scripture it immediately follows the Hebrew letter Ayin  $\bigcirc$ .





Ayin is the 16th letter in the Hebrew Aleph ♥ Beyt □, and Pey ✓ is the 17th.

We notice that it is used in conjunction with the word OVER that we learned is the literal Hebrew word of AYIN ① LAMED 7 not just once but twice.

Ayin is a picture of the eye and it means to see and understand.

Pey is the picture of the mouth and it means to speak a word.

The two words that show up for the first time with the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> letters in the Hebrew Aleph ♥ Beyt □, as we just read in *Genesis 1:2*, reveal a powerful picture and one we need to understand.

First, we are introduced to a presence, something that is intelligent that is hovering over the water and it is described as Dark and Void.

Where is it hovering?

It is hovering **OVER** the **FACE** of the deep.

Now we have a second something that is intelligent overshadowing the Dark Presence. The Holy Spirit we are now told is vibrating **OVER** the **FACE** of the deep.

In both cases when we investigate the meaning of the words **OVER** and **FACE** we discover intelligence and plan at work. Is one plan evil and the other good? Or are both plans good?

Is darkness and void good? Our immediate response would be *no*. And perhaps that is the correct interpretation. The caution is that God says he and he alone can both dwell in and use darkness to accomplish His purposes. So, we need to be careful.


We can say this for sure. When the Holy Spirit shows up the Darkness that was upon the Face of the Deep disappears into the Light that results from the vibrating of the Holy Spirit.

The other thing we can be sure of is that whatever is at work in the first three verses in the bible is alive and intelligent.

Consider the meaning of the word Face in Genesis 1:2 and ask yourself if this is a picture of an inanimate object or thing.

The **FACE** of the deep.

The Hebrew word Face that begins with the picture of Pey / can be translated as follows.



Pey means to speak a word

Noon means life and is pictures as a fish or a growing sprout
 Yood is pictured as an arm and it mean to do a work and the highest spiritual meaning is to do a **DIVINE WORK.**

So, whatever it is that is **OVER** the **FACE** is not inanimate. It is alive, speaking a word and doing so with a plan in mind.

In the first use of the word **FACE**, could it be a demonic plan that is Over the Face of the Deep that is described as Dark and Void? Or is it part of a Divine



plan? We need to be careful how we answer that question because although we cannot use chaos and darkness to achieve anything good, God and God alone can.

In the second use of the word **FACE** we are not left to wonder as it is the Holy Spirit that is **OVER** the Darkness and **VOID** for the purpose of changing the Darkness into **LIGHT**.

Pey is an amazing letter in the Hebrew Aleph  $\nabla$  Beyt  $\Box$  and whenever we see it we should consider what word is being spoken. Something is coming out of the mouth of God that we need to know and understand.

We can see how it was first used in the Scripture. We see that it is connected with a Divine Purpose. To discover more about the Divine purpose of Pey 🥖 we invite you to consider Pey / the Number 80.

The first time Ayin is used it is in the context of a picture of the Darkness. The second time something new is introduced, the Holy Spirit is hovering over • the chaotic face of the waters that were void and dark.

The darkness that was **OVER** the face of the deep created a void and it is not replaced but it is covered, over-arched by another presence. Something else is now **OVER** the darkness. A greater authority with a new UNDERSTANDING.

The Holy Spirit, we are told, moved upon the face of the waters. The literal translation from the Hebrew tell us that the Holy Spirit moved OVER the face of the waters.

The letter Pey / is also the number 80.

The number 80 is a ten-fold magnification of the number 8 which is the number that means New Beginnings, New Birth and Eternity.

When you assemble the picture and number meaning of Pey / the message unfolds loud and clear.

Our mouths were designed to declare the glory of our Lord and our Savior through all Eternity.

The original picture of the Letter Tsade was a symbol of a hook. This hook was probably used as a harvesting tool and would have been useful for collecting the bounty of the Garden of Eden.

While the word for the letter Tsade / is not in the Bible it is used as a part of many Hebrew words that agree with the picture of the hook that symbolizes Pulling Something Forward, Catching Something in way it cannot escape, To Strongly Desire, Trouble and finally to HARVEST.

The Letter Tsade / is also the number 90.




Let's look at some of the words where the Hebrew letter Tsade / symbolizes the concept of the Hook and Fishing. This can be found in *Matthew 11:21*.

So, we might summarize it as follows. Tsade pictured as a hook illustrates the concept of catching or snagging something in order to pull it forward for the purpose of harvesting it. This could include everything from a fish to a piece of fruit.

The picture meaning of Tsade includes the point of view of both the one doing the catching and whatever it is that is being snagged or caught.

So, it is not a surprise that \( \int \) is the one letter that means to have a strong desire for something. To be "hooked on something" as we would say in the modern vernacular.

This desire can be good or it can be bad, healthy or destructive.

The word Desire for example in Hebrew is pictured as Tsade or a Hook that snags and pulls the heart.

A strong desire can become a life-threatening addiction and so it is no surprise that we find the idea of being unable to escape embedded in the meaning of the picture of the fishhook.






oof ♥ is the 19<sup>th</sup> LETTER in the Hebrew Aleph ♥ Beyt □.

Qoof ♥ is also the very important number 100.

The original picture of the letter Qoof  $\P$  is the Back of the Head.



As you can see, the symbol for the letter QOOF has changed over time from the ORIGINAL to the MODERN. The basic concept of the back of the head is retained in the Modern Hebrew Script.



QOOF

Qoof, pictured as the back of the head, illustrates the concept of the Last and the Least and behind.

One of the easiest ways to confirm the concept or idea being illustrated by a pictographic Hebrew letter is to see how the letter is used in Hebrew words found in the bible. Let's look at the Scriptures to see the picture it illustrates and the idea it communicates.

The letter Qoof  $\P$  is pictured as the back of the head which also has the idea of a dome. We can find the meaning of Dome in one of the first words in the



#### **FIRMAMENT**



The Firmament is a picture of an over (Reysh) head, solid (Qoof) (Reysh) dome, that was (Yood) ordained in heaven to accomplish a purpose on the earth. A purpose that was to be (Reysh) (Ayin) seen and understood.

Let's look at another idea contained in the pictograph Qoof  $\P$  .

What is the last thing you see when someone is leaving?

You see the back of the head.

Qoof  $\P$  also has the idea of leaving, never staying anyplace too long. We might say that Qoof  $\P$  has the idea of the wandering pilgrim or more specifically the Wandering Jew that is always leaving one place to go to another, and what you see is the back of their heads as they leave.

In addition to the idea of the circle contained around the perimeter of a dome (to be clear a circle is not a ball), Qoof  $\P$  has the idea of a hollow like the hollow of the palm of your hand when you hold something.

In other words, the Hebrew letter Qoof  $\P$  has the idea of circling and a hollow. What is in view is not a continual cycle but rather the picture of a beginning and an ending.

So, it is not surprising that Qoof  $\P$  also means to move in a circle or to complete a circle or a circuit.

8 By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed; and he went out, not knowing whither he went.





Yes, it is called a **PROMISE**.


















eysh is the 20th letter in the Hebrew Aleph ₩ Beyt □.

REYSH

Reysh ? is pictured as a man wearing a crown.

Reysh  $\bigcirc$  is also the Number 200. The first thing we notice about the number 200 is the prominence of the number 2.



We will explore the spiritual significance of what that means in our study of Reysh  $\nearrow$  the number 200.

# **REYSH** ? 200

The original picture of the letter Reysh  $^{igodota}$  is distinctive because of all the letters in the original Hebrew Pictographic 22 letter Aleph  $^{igodota}$  Beyt  $^{igodota}$ , it is the most complex and the most recognizable.







Notice that Reysh is pictured as a head that looks like it is wearing a crown or a headpiece that marks it out as something special. Something that is meant to cause us to wonder.

What does it mean?

Its elevated meaning is as a man who is the head man or the man in charge.





Its supernatural meaning is not hard to figure out. Reysh  $\bigcirc$  as we have already noted is the spiritual and supernatural revelation of just one personage.

That personage is the 2<sup>nd</sup> person in the Trinity, God the Son. It is a spiritual picture of Jesus the Christ who is the Prince of Heaven and will one day be worshipped by all men who will bend the knee and acknowledge that Jesus Christ is the King of Kings and the **LORD** of Lords.



It is no surprise that the Pictograph of a Head signifies the Most Important Person, the Ruler or the Prince.

200

The letter Reysh  $\bigcirc$  is also the number 200.

Whenever you see a Hebrew letter that is also a number which contains a zero, we are meant to understand its meaning based on two basic principles.

The first principle is that the meaning of the number is connected to the first use of the number.

Let me explain.





Zero is not a number. It has no value of its own except as a multiplier and place holder.

To understand the meaning of the number 200, we first must understand the meaning of the number 2.

The number two follows the number 1. The number 1 has the core spiritually significant and supernatural meaning of **GOD** the Father.

The number that follows is the number 2. A number that is connected to the idea of the SON.

The Hebrew letter Beyt □ is also the number 2 and is pictured as a House.

The number 2 identifies the person living in the house.

It is the Beyt □, number 2, Reysh ♦, number 200.

Beyt Reysh is the Hebrew word for **SON**.

Reysh  $\bigcirc$  is number 200, Reysh  $\bigcirc$  is the head person or the prince that lives in the house of the Father, number 1.

The supernatural significance of this number reveals that He is the Son of God.

Space does not permit a lengthy explanation of this spiritual principle as we look at how God designed the numbers to work perfectly together to reveal spiritual truth.



The first use of any number reveals it meaning as a part of another word or number or multiplied and amplified in its meaning by adding zeros to the number.

If the most elevated meaning of the number 2 is as the Son of God. Then the most Elevated meaning of the number 200 has to do with the mission of the

Son of God in Time and Space as indicated by the two space holders, the two zeros in this number.

He is the **LORD** of **LORDS** on a mission.

But are we missing something?

What is the mission?

That *something* is the revelation regarding the number Two we discover in the number 20.

Twenty is a picture of **ATONEMENT** as we have already learned.

So, by looking at the number 2, 20 and **200** we have a complete revelation of the basic narrative God intended us to understand regarding the number two, twenty and two hundred. It all has to do with number 2, the Son.

First, we have the Hebrew letter Beyt represented by the picture of a house and number 2 we know that God has a Son.

Second, it is represented by the picture of the palm of a hand that covers and the number 20. In the number 200, which is  $10 \times 20$  (remember that 20 is the number that means Salvation  $\times 10$  the sacred number or Ordinal Perfection and the number that signifies that a heavenly plan is at work on the earth).





Sheen **W** is pictured as teeth that crush and destroy.








The original picture of the letter Sheen W is as Teeth.




If you believe God's word then you must bend the knee and bow the head in order to receive an understanding of His words that will certainly result in a mental conflict.

The world has made its peace with God in the main by simply destroying his word and replacing it with his own thoughts and then arrogantly attributing them to a God of his own imagination.




**300** = Victory over Enemy:

#### **300** = Burial and Resurrection of the Messiah

Interesting that the first use of the number 300 is in reference to Enoch who did not die. The second reference to the number 300 is in reference to Noah, who by God's grace was saved from the flood.

It was Jesus himself who prophesied that this act of love and devotion would be a part of the gospel story of His death, burial and resurrection.

All the other scriptural references, including the ones not listed in this book, refer to a supernatural victory over the enemies of God.

Gideon and his band of 300 are victorious over the enemy supernaturally.

Samson is given the ability to perform impossible feats of strength and victory over the enemies by supernatural means.

And the final example of the number 300 in the Scriptures is a picture of grace and resurrection.







## THE NUMERICAL MEANING

The meaning of the number 300 is clear based on how it is used in Scripture. It clearly means victory over the enemies of God.

The number 300 is connected with the grace of God and the Son of God's victory over death and the grave.

#### **300** = Victory over Enemy

As we search for the meaning of the number three hundred let us not forget that three hundred is the third manifestation of the number 3 in the Hebrew Aleph  $\checkmark$  Beyt  $\Box$ .

The first time three is used it is in the number Gimel  $\setminus$ , the 3rd letter in the Hebrew Aleph  $\forall$  Beyt  $\square$ .

You have just learned on of the amazing ways God uses His numbers to communicate His Truth in order to accomplish our Salvation.







av is the  $22^{nd}$  and final LETTER in the Hebrew Aleph  $\checkmark$  Beyt  $\Box$ .

Tay  $\uparrow$  is also the largest number in the Hebrew Aleph  $\checkmark$  Beyt  $\Box$ , the number 400.

There is a mystery connected with the letter Tav † that is first revealed in the 16<sup>th</sup> letter revealed in the first book of the Bible.

It is there that we discover right in the middle between "In the beginning God Created... "and the heavens and the earth" a two-letter mystery that begins with Aleph and ends with Tav ..."

The answer is found in the book of Revelation where the Son of God identifies himself, and solves the mystery.



Are you kidding me?








The answer is NO. This is a faithful representation of the original pictograph, crossed sticks that resemble a wooden cross.

Tay, the picture of crossed sticks or a cross, has the meaning of a SIGN or a Covenant.





To be clear this number includes **ALL** Creation, not just man. It includes the heaven and the earth and every living thing that dwells in it.

The picture of Tav , the picture of the wooden cross that is a sign and a covenant has partially been fulfilled as a prophetic sign. It took place at the Cross of Calvary where the judicial covenant that undergirds all God's works took place.

God died for all his creation on the cross of Calvary, **ALL** men and women who receive God's legal settlement with mankind, this final verdict that was completed on the Cross. **20** For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope,

<sup>21</sup> Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.






<sup>22</sup> For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now.



9	Judgement of man, wrath, conclusion of a matter, summation of man's works.
10	Ordinal perfection, perfection of divine order, divinely ordered events, completeness of order, the law.
20	Redemption, concentrated meaning of ordinal perfection, expectancy.







30	Blood of Christ, blood sacrifice, dedication, magnified perfection of divine order marking the right moment.
